Assistant Professor (2 Positions)

Description

The school of nursing at Eastern Illinois University is accepting applications for two full-time, 9-month, tenure-track faculty positions at the rank of Assistant Professor. The desired start date is August 15, 2021. The department seeks candidates who are committed to student learning, and the academic and clinical instruction of undergraduate nursing students in traditional BSN and RN-BSN programs. Duties include teaching courses; clinical instruction; research; and service. Mentoring and advising students, contribution to faculty governance, and engagement in program research is expected.

Department

The vision of the school of nursing is to promote health and well-being through innovative, concept guided and interprofessional education, cultivate quality nursing practice, serve diverse local/global populations, and instill commitment to lifelong learning.

The school of nursing is comprised of an established fully online RN-BSN program and new traditional BSN program. Faculty collaboratively work together to provide students, both online and on-ground, with the best educational experiences and preparation.

University and Its Community

Eastern Illinois University, located in the east-central Illinois community of Charleston, has a rich tradition of over 120 years of preparing students to accomplish their professional and life goals through a combination of quality academics and personal relationships. The beautiful, 320-acre campus is host to approximately 7,500 students and 400 faculty members in a town of approximately 20,000 residents. EIU offers active research opportunities, cultural events, NCAA Division I athletics, and an engaged student body that are on par with larger universities. Charleston has all the advantages of a small, rural town (e.g., lower cost of living, a safe community, a short commute) within a two to three-hour drive of Chicago, Indianapolis, and St. Louis.

Duties:

- Teach in undergraduate traditional BSN and online RN-BSN programs
- Provide direct classroom, laboratory, and clinical instruction
- Participate in maintenance, preparation, and implementation of activities in the nursing laboratory
- Advise and mentor students
- Engage in research and other creative scholarly activities
- Engage in service at the program, college, and university level

- Participate in assessment and curriculum and program development
- Maintain licensure and participate in professional practice, workshops, and continuing education
- Contribute to faculty governance
- Travel to clinical sites expected
- Engage in other duties as assigned

Qualifications

- 1) Prepared at the doctoral level (PhD, EdD, DNP, DHSc). If doctorate not in nursing, Master's in Nursing required. Candidates will be considered if enrolled in a doctoral program and completion date within one year.
- 2) Preparation and clinical experience in medical-surgical nursing, obstetrics, psychiatric, pediatrics, or public health nursing.
- 3) Minimum of three years of clinical practice experience.
- 4) Candidates must be willing to teach in a concept-base curriculum and willing to complete professional development in concept guided education.
- 5) Preference for experience teaching in a nursing program and online teaching experience. Candidates must be qualified to teach online at Eastern Illinois University. Qualification is established through evidence of prior distance education training and experience or through the successful completion of the EIU Online Course Development Institute. - 6) Licensed Registered Nurse in Illinois or prior to start date.
- 7) Passion for innovative student-centered teaching and the ability to learn and implement new technology and pedagogy.
- 8) Ability to work collaboratively with other colleagues and administrators in the School of Nursing.
- 9) Commitment to inclusion and diversity.
- 10) Commitment to teaching, scholarship, and service at the college and university level.

Review of completed applications will begin January 11, 2021. Preference will be given to applications received by January 11th. The position will be open until filled. A complete application includes a) letter of application addressing strengths and experience relative to the qualifications and responsibilities of the position and indication of the position(s) applying for; b) current CV; c) unofficial transcripts; and, d) names and contact information of five professional references who can comment on relevant clinical and/or academic teaching experience.
