Instructor/Non-tenure track position

Responsibilities:

The EIU Department of Teaching, Learning, and Foundations seeks a non-tenure track faculty member to teach courses in Curriculum and Instruction; develop knowledge and skills related to effective planning, teaching, and assessment in grades 9-12; evaluate students' performance relative to CAEP and Illinois State Board of Education standards; guide related field experiences; supervise students in field experiences; and foster professional relationships with public school partners. The position is a benefited, full-time, 9-month appointment with potential for renewal and summer assignments. The course schedule will require teaching during the day and supervision of practicum students in various school settings and may also include teaching undergraduate and/or graduate courses utilizing online, on-campus, or blended formats.

Successful candidates will be committed to department mission of providing current and future educators with the knowledge, skills, and dispositions to meet the challenges of today's secondary classroom.

Successful candidates must have familiarity with teaching, learning, educational technology, and education theories; knowledge of current state and national teaching and learning standards; ability to work collegially with other members of the faculty; utilize opportunities for cross-disciplinary collaboration; professional written and oral communication skills; and demonstrate commitment to diversity and promote inclusive excellence.

Qualifications:

The educational/experience requirements for this position are as follows:

Required:

- Master's degree from an accredited university in Curriculum & Instruction or closely related field.
- Minimum of 3 years of teaching experience in grades 9-12 public school setting in the United States.

Preferred:

- Experience teaching at the college/university level, including supervision of pre-service field placements.
- Experience teaching online courses.
- Experience with partnerships between public schools and universities.
