Assistant Professor/Tenure-Track/Journalism

The School of Communication and Journalism at Eastern Illinois University seeks candidates for a full-time, 9-month, tenure-track Assistant Professor of Journalism position with a desired start date of August 14, 2023. Primary duties will include teaching courses in the journalism curriculum with an emphasis on reporting across multimedia platforms. The ideal candidate will have professional experience involving new media journalism and possess multimedia and social media skills. Teaching experience required and student media advising highly desired.

In addition to these primary duties, the candidate will teach other Journalism Division courses as needed. Research, service and creative activities are expected.

Qualifications

Ph.D. or MFA preferred but candidates with a master's degree and strong professional experience are encouraged to apply. All candidates are expected to have professional experience. Evidence of a clear research or creative activity agenda and excellent teaching are required along with strong communication skills. Demonstrated commitment to diversity and experience promoting inclusive excellence is required. The educational requirements for tenure are a master's degree plus one of the following: 1) 30 semester hours of graduate coursework in the discipline or 2) 30 semester hours or more of graduate coursework that meets departmental needs.

Deadline

Review of applications will begin November 1, 2022 and continue until interviews are scheduled.

Application

A complete application will consist of a letter of application, current curriculum vitae, unofficial transcripts (official copy required for appointment), statement of teaching philosophy and evidence of teaching effectiveness, a professional portfolio that includes 3-5 reporting examples, and the contact information for three references.
