

Assistant/Associate Professor of Counseling

The Human Development Counseling Program (HDC) is pleased to invite applicants for tenure or tenure track position. Accredited by CACREP, HDC offers concentrations in Marriage, Couple, and Family Counseling (MCFC); Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC) and School Counseling.

Required Qualifications Include:

- Doctoral Degree in Counselor Education from a CACREP-approved program by date of appointment.
- Professional Identity as a Counselor Educator as indicated by affiliations with relevant professional counseling associations (e.g., ACA, ACES, AMHCA).
- Experience with CACREP accreditation.
- Commitment to social justice and experience working with diverse students
- Demonstrated experience with program evaluation, including systematic assessment of student learning
- Licensure as an LPC or LCPC in the state of Illinois within two years of appointment.

Preferred Qualifications Include:

- Clinical Mental Health Counseling specialization
- University-level teaching and supervision experience, in CACREP core and CMH areas.
- Experience writing and procuring grants
- Demonstrated record of scholarship.
- Knowledge and skill working with program assessment

Faculty in HDC teach three courses per semester, including courses in specialization curriculum, as well as the counseling core. Possible courses may include: alcoholism and substance abuse, neurobiology of trauma, appraisal techniques in counseling, research methods, practicum, and internship. Non-teaching responsibilities include: co-coordination of the CMH area of study, provision of clinical supervision, academic advisement and mentorship, supervision of comprehensive examination closure processes, and active participation in program evaluation and assessment processes. The University emphasizes teaching and expects ongoing scholarly and university service activities.
